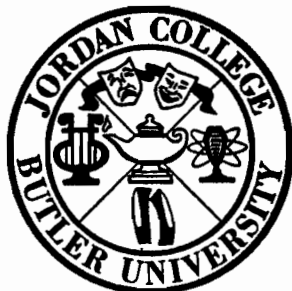

## The Conductor

MR. JAGER is a widely recognized composer. His compositions have been played throughout the United States, as well as in Canada, South America, Europe and Japan. He has received nearly two dozen commissions for his music from some of the most outstanding bands and performing groups in the country.

He has received a number of awards for his music. He is the only person to receive the famous Ostwald Award of the American Bandmaster's Association three different times—in 1964, 1968, and 1972. In addition, he has twice received the "Roth Award" of the National School Orchestra Association, the Phi Kappa Lambda composition award, and the Distinguished Service to Music medal in composition from Kappa Kappa Psi (1973). He has received the ASCAP "Standards Award" each year since 1967. This past summer Jager was chosen Tennessee Composer of the Year.

In 1970, Alpha Sigma Chapter of Phi Mu Alpha-Sinfonia at the Jordan College of Music commissioned Mr. Jager to write a composition for concert band. The resulting composition, *Sinfonietta*, was premiered at Butler University under the composer's direction. Later that year it was performed by the Butler Symphonic Band at the North Central Division Meeting of the College Band Directors National Association, held at Northern Illinois University. At the Division meeting it was selected as the best original composition and the representative composition from the Division for performance at the CBDNA National Convention.
