THE CONDUCTORS

MR. JOHN P. PAYNTER has been Director of Bands at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois since 1953. In addition to heading the band program, he serves the School of Music as Professor and Chairman of the Department of Conducting and Performing Organizations.

Mr. Paynter was born and reared in Mineral Point, Wisconsin where he received his early training in music. He entered the School of Music at Northwestern University in 1946 and earned BM and MM degrees in theory and composition in 1950 and 1951, and served as Acting Director of Bands in 1950-1951 while working toward his Masters degree. At age 23 he was appointed to the full-time faculty (1951), became Director of the Marching Band, Assistant Director of Bands and Instructor of Theory. Two years later, he succeeded Glenn Cliffe Bainum as Director of Bands, only the second person to hold this post in Northwestern University history.

He is editor of the "New Music" column of the *Instrumentalist* music magazine and an active composer and arranger, with more than 400 works to his credit.

Mr. Paynter is presently President of the Mid-West National Band and Orchestra Clinic and President of the North Central Division of the College Band Directors National Association.

As one of the leading Band conductors in America, Mr. Paynter has gained the respect of musicians everywhere, as evidenced by his high standing in the organizations he serves: American Bandmasters Association (Past President), the National Band Association (co-founder and Past President), College Band Directors National Association, Music Educators National Conference and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia (life member). In 1982, the Northshore Concert Band honored Paynter for his 25 years as conductor and musical director; also marking the 25 years since the Band's inception and his service to the organization as it marked its Silver Anniversary.

EDWARD J. DOWNING is a graduate of the University of Michigan, where he earned both his Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degrees.

He has taught in the public schools of Michigan for eighteen years, having held positions in Wyandotte, Flint, Belleville and Ann Arbor. In addition to his public school work, Mr. Downing has held appointments at the University of Michigan, conducting the University Wind Ensemble and Varsity Band and serving as an Assistant Conductor with the Marching Band.

An active adjudicator and guest conductor, Mr. Downing has served as conductor of the Michigan, New Jersey, Indiana and West Virginia All-State Bands and was selected by the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association as teacher of the year.

On five separate occasions, Mr. Downing has conducted youth bands on summer trips in Europe under the auspices of Musical Youth International and Youth For Understanding. The Musical Youth International Band, under his direction, won first prize at the Tees-side International Eisteddfod in Middlesborough, England.

Mr. Downing is currently Vice President and Director of the National Music Camp at Interlochen, an eight-week program in the fine arts which each summer brings over 2,500 students to the wooded campus in northern Michigan. His appointment in 1979 made him only the third Director in the Camp's 56-year history. He is also a faculty member of the Interlochen Arts Academy, an independent college-preparatory fine arts boarding school, where he serves as conductor of the Academy Band.
