2025 IBA All-State Band Guest Conductor

Dr. Caroline Beatty

As Director of Bands and Professor of Music at Texas State University, Caroline Beatty conducts the Texas State Wind Symphony, leads the graduate wind band conducting program, teaches undergraduate conducting and band literature courses, and provides primary oversight for the comprehensive band program.

Performances under her direction garner consistent accolades from audience members, composers, and fellow performers for their artistry, excitement, and craft. The Texas State University Wind Symphony has been recognized for musical excellence through multiple invitations to perform for the National Conference of the College Band Directors National Association, the Southwestern Division of CBDNA, and the Texas Music Educators Association.



Dr. Beatty maintains a vibrant conducting and teaching schedule outside of the university. International engagements include leading the Summer Conducting School for the Australia Band and Orchestra Directors Association as well as the serving as Chief Clinician for the Victoria School Music Festival where she enjoyed connecting with over 80 Australian school bands. Domestic invitations have included opportunities to conduct Concordia Santa Fe, the World Youth Wind Symphony at the Interlochen Center for the Arts, and numerous All-State and regional honor bands.

Prior to her current position, Dr. Beatty held the position of Associate Director of Bands at Texas State and, earlier, at Northwestern State University-Louisiana. Her secondary school teaching experience includes thirteen years as a high school band director in the Houston area. She holds the DMA degree in Conducting from the University of Michigan and both a MM degree in Conducting and a BM degree in Music Education from The University of Texas at Austin.

Dr. Beatty is currently the President of the Southwestern Division of CBDNA and holds membership in the Texas Music Educators Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, and Phi Beta Mu.

2025 IBA All-State Honor Band Guest Conductor

Dr. Jon Noworyta

Jon Noworyta is in his eighth season as the Artistic Director of the Queen City Freedom Band of Cincinnati, OH. Noworyta is the Associate Professor of Music and Director of Bands, Instrumental Activities, and Educational Outreach at the University of Indianapolis. There, he administers all aspects of the woodwind, brass, and percussion area, teaches basic and advanced conducting, courses in music education, and conducts the Symphonic Wind Ensemble, Pep Band, and opera. A versatile conductor who is equally comfortable with orchestras as well as wind and brass groups, he is the Music Director of the Crossroads Brass Band of Indianapolis, IN, and the former Assistant Conductor of the Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra. Ensembles under his direction have given notable local, state, national, and international performances, the most significant being Carnegie Hall in 2009, the 2010 Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic (rehearsal lab), and the 2012 Music for All National Festival. Noworyta has led groups at legendary venues as Chicago's Symphony Center, the Kennedy Center, the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, and Carnegie Hall.

Noworyta's professional affiliations have included the NAFME, CBDNA, WASBE, NABBA, NBA, IBA, Pride Bands Alliance, GLSEN, the Conductors Guild, and the Indiana, Illinois, New York (NYSSMA) and Ohio Music Educators Associations. Noworyta was recently inducted into the Phi Beta Mu International Bandmasters Fraternity, is listed among the *Who's Who in America* Educator's Edition, and is a founding member on the advisory team for the 32,000+ member "Band Director" Facebook group. Noworyta has been published as a contributor to two GIA volumes and is a co-editor for the Indiana Music Educators Association publication "INFORM."



A Western New York native, Noworyta holds degrees from Baldwin-Wallace University (BME), Northwestern University (MM), and the College-Conservatory of Music of the University of Cincinnati (DMA). Additional study as a participant in conducting workshops at the Eastman School of Music, the New England Conservatory, and the Juilliard School, has given Noworyta the opportunity to work with the major conducting pedagogues in the field today.

2025 Indiana Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu Outstanding Bandmaster Daniel Tembras

Daniel Tembras serves as the Director of Instrumental Studies at Purdue University Fort Wayne. His duties include conducting the Symphonic Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band, teaching courses in conducting and music education, and coordinating the woodwind, brass, and percussion areas. Dr. Tembras holds a DMA degree in Wind Conducting from The University of Texas at Austin. Prior to this, he served as the Assistant to the Director of Bands at The University of Texas at Austin, Director of the Longhorn Jazz Band and Combo, and Assistant Director of the Longhorn Basketball and Volleyball Bands. Dr. Tembras received the Master of Music degree in Wind Conducting from Michigan State University.

While in Michigan, Dr. Tembras served as a director in the Mason Public Schools in Mason, Michigan, and in the Kearsley Community Schools in Flint, Michigan. Dr. Tembras is a native of Lansing, Michigan, and received his Bachelor of Music degree from Michigan State University.

A champion of artistic collaboration and new music, Tembras has premiered and/or collaborated with leading artists including Pulitzer Prize winning composer William Bolcom, Emmy-winning Bruce Broughton, David Maslanka, Frank Ticheli, John Mackey, Steven Bryant, Joel Puckett, Omar Thomas, Michael Markowski and soloists Billy Hunter, Principal Trumpet of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra, New Orleans clarinetist Doreen Ketchens, Gail Williams, Joseph Lulloff, and Kenneth Tse, amongst others.

Dr. Tembras is a frequent guest conductor and clinician throughout the United States, with engagements throughout Europe, including Spain, Mexico, and the Beijing Central Conservatory of Music in Beijing, China. He has had the honor of guest conducting the United States Army Field Band and the “President’s Own” Marine Band. Each summer, Dr. Tembras works with The World Youth Wind Orchestra Project (WYWOP) and World Adults Wind Orchestra Project (WAWOP) in Schladming, Austria as part of the Mid-Europe International Festival, ensembles comprised of talented international musicians from Europe, Australia, Japan, and North America. Tembras led the Symphonic Wind Ensemble in their debut performance in Carnegie Hall in New York City in 2015 and has led the Symphonic Wind Ensemble on two tours of Europe performing in some of the world’s greatest concert halls. University bands under his direction have performed numerous times at the Indiana Music Educators Association conference as well as at the College Band Directors National Association Conference. Dr. Tembras is a member of the College Band Directors National Association, NAFME, the Indiana Bandmasters Association, and honorary member of Phi Mu Alpha and Phi Beta Mu.



2025 Indiana Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame Steven Barber

Steven Barber is a highly accomplished and resolute music educator with a career spanning over four decades. A 1973 graduate of Greater Johnstown Central High School (Pennsylvania), he went on to earn a Bachelor of Music Education from Edinboro University of Pennsylvania in 1977 and a Master of Science Degree from Indiana University in 1982.

Beginning as a music educator at Henryville Jr.-Sr. High School from 1977 to 1987, Barber founded and developed a competitive marching and concert band program that achieved significant success, including three consecutive appearances at state finals in Class D.



In June of 1987, he joined Homestead High School where his visionary leadership brought local, state, and national acclaim to Homestead's band and music program. Under his guidance the band performed at prestigious events such as the Tournament of Roses Parade, Fiesta Bowl Parade, and various high-profile exhibitions, concerts, and competitions across the country, including Indiana, Florida, Arizona, California, and Washington D.C. The Homestead Spartan Alliance Band appeared in thirty consecutive ISSMA State Marching Band Finals and won five Class A championships during his tenure. The band also appeared four times at the Bands of America Grand National Championship Finals. The symphonic band and jazz ensemble have also received numerous superior ratings and recognition for their outstanding achievements. The band received the prestigious John Philip Sousa Foundation – Sudler Shield Award in 2011.

Throughout his career Barber earned numerous accolades, including the Homestead High School Teacher of the Year Award (1993), Southwest Allen County Schools Teacher of the Year Award (1993), Excellence in Education Award (1993), and Michiana Outstanding Teacher of the Year Award (2015). He was also a semifinalist for the Indiana Teacher of the Year Award in 1994.

Beyond the awards and achievements, he has taken a personal interest in mentoring and inspiring students, instilling in them the values and skills needed to become successful adults, and exemplary musicians, workers, and citizens. Steven Barber created and maintained a long-standing tradition of excellence during his forty years of teaching in Indiana and retired in 2017.

Indiana Bandmasters Association

Purpose

1. To stimulate interest in the study of the band and its literature.
2. To develop a desire for good band literature.
3. To encourage good fellowship between the members of the Association.
4. To bring the work of the Association before the Indiana Department of Education and the citizens of the State in order that it shall gain greater recognition and support.
5. To provide educational meetings for band directors to raise the standards of instruction.
6. To secure recognition of School Administrators and Boards of Education to the effect that the band is an integral part of the school curriculum and is entitled to recognition as a curricular subject.
7. To develop a band in each community which shall serve as a vital force in bringing people into closer relationship with the schools of the State.
8. To assure that no person on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, age, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, or disability be discriminated against, is excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination in any program or activity of the organization.

History

Founded in 1953, the Indiana Bandmasters Association would initially engage in sponsoring a Marching Band Clinic, an All-State Band, and act in an advisory capacity for Indiana Music Education Association (IMEA) on band activities. The first Marching Band Clinic was organized in the fall of 1956 and continued each year through the summer of 1979. IBA would sponsor its first All-State Band in 1961 with John Paynter as the guest conductor. The event went to two ensembles, the All-State Band and the All-State Honor Band, in 1980. The first Junior High All-Region Bands were organized in the fall of 1980 at three sites. As interest grew the number of sites was increased to the current fifteen. In 1994 the event was renamed the All-Region Honor Band Festival.

The first IBA commission was premiered at the 1988 All-State Honor Band concert with the composer, Robert Jager, conducting. The Association premiered the first junior high commission by John O'Reilly at the All-Region Festivals later that fall. The winter of 1995 saw the first collaboration of the Indiana chapter of the College Band Directors' National Association (CBDNA) and IBA to sponsor the Indiana All-Collegiate Honor Band. The group now is formed biannually to perform at the Indiana Music Education Association Professional Development Conference.

In 1999 IBA established All-District Honor Bands for students in grades nine through twelve, performing at six sites in the fall of 2000. The first All-District Band commission, by Robert Sheldon, was premiered in the fall of 2005. IBA now commissions at least one new work for concert band each school year.

In 2005, the membership of IBA established the "Ray Cramer Scholarship" a \$1000 grant to be awarded annually to a senior member of the All-State Bands who will pursue a career in music. Previous scholarship recipients are:
