

Robert T. Carr

Robert T. Carr was born in 1922. He graduated from Lafayette Jefferson High School. He received his B.S. degree from Indiana State University in 1946 and earned his master's degree from ISU in 1947. In 1969 he was awarded the Ed.D. from Indiana University.

Dr. Carr taught music in the Indiana public schools from 1947 until 1958 in Brazil High School, Washington High School, Vincennes-Lincoln High School, Richmond High School. He was music supervisor for the Richmond Schools and also for the Terre-Haute-Vigo County Schools.

In 1965 Dr. Carr assumed the position as the first Indiana State Department of Instruction Music Supervisor where he remained until he joined the music education faculty at Ball State University in 1968. While at Ball State he was chairman of the Department of Music Education. Dr. Carr was active in IMEA, serving as both Executive Secretary-Treasurer and Editor of *the Musicator*.

Honors awarded this outstanding Hoosier Musician include the Phi Delta Kappa Garland Hardy Award and induction into the Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame. Dr. Carr and his wife Araminta resided in Muncie at the time of his death in 1983.
